Re: D Street, 14th Street, and Kentucky Avenue SE Intersection Improvements

Dear Commissioner Holman:

Pursuant to the “Administrative Procedure Amendment Act of 2000” D.C. LAW 13-249 (48 DCR 3491 April 20, 2001), the District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is required to give a written notice of our intent to modify traffic and/or parking requirements. This letter is being forwarded to you for the purpose of notification and solicitation of comments on our intent to implement the following modifications in your jurisdiction.

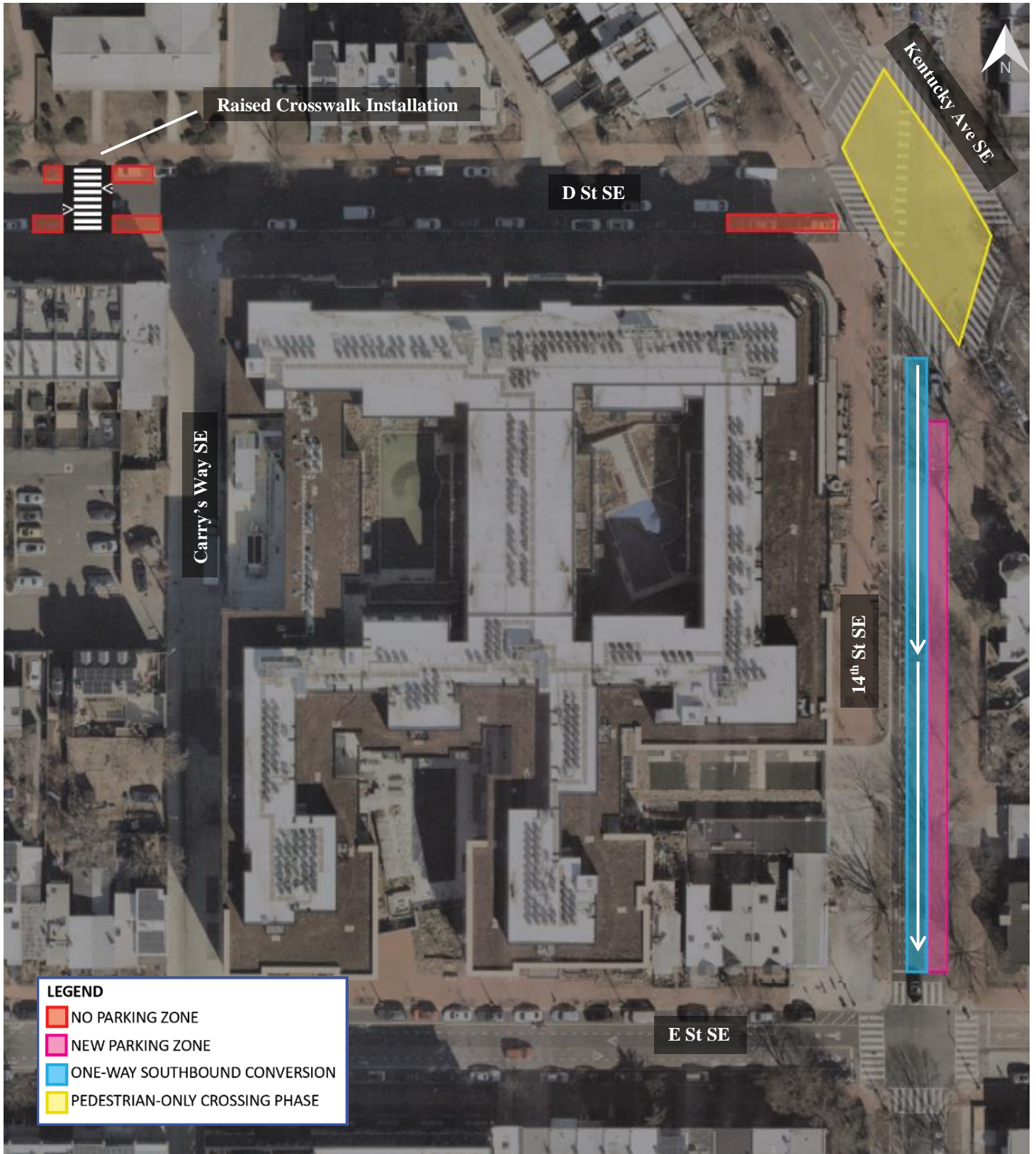
- **D Street, 14th Street, and Kentucky Avenue SE Operational Improvements**

Currently the D Street, 14th Street, and Kentucky Avenue SE intersection is controlled by traffic signals at all approaches. Both approaches on D Street and both approaches on Kentucky Avenue allow for two-way traffic through the intersection. The North leg of 14th Street allows Southbound traffic only and the South leg of 14th allows for two-way traffic. Based on an intersection operation and safety study, DDOT has determined that the following recommendations should be implemented to improve this intersection:

- Modifying the traffic signal timing at the intersection to allow for a pedestrian-only crossing phase (Known as “Barnes Dance”)
- Conversion of the South leg of 14th Street between D Street and E Street to one-way Southbound, eliminating the Northbound travel lane
- Addition of on-street parking on 14th Street between D Street and E Street, where there is now a Northbound travel lane, adding approximately fifteen (15) parking spaces
- Installation of a raised crosswalk on D Street just west of Carry’s Way, removing approximately five (5) parking spaces
- Addition of a no parking zone on D Street in front of the Safeway entrance, removing approximately three (3) parking spaces.

Figure 1 illustrates the proposed operational changes to the intersection that will take place as part of the improvements.

All comments on this subject matter must be filed in writing by (thirty days after the date of this notice), with the District Department of Transportation (DDOT), Project Delivery Administration at 250 M Street, SE, Washington, D.C. 20003. DDOT will review and evaluate comments and anticipates initiating implementation of the above-mentioned modifications starting at the end of the thirty business days, pending weather conditions.
