**Re: NOI 22-213 TESD
Removal of Parking for Westbound Massachusetts Avenue NW between 6th Street NW
and 7th Street/I Street NW**

Dear Chairpersons Shankle and Eichler:

Pursuant to the “Administrative Procedure Amendment Act of 2000” D.C. LAW 13-249 (48 DCR 3491 April 20, 2001), the District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is required to give a written notice of our intent to modify traffic and/or parking requirements. This letter is being forwarded to you for the purpose of notification and solicitation of comments on our intent to implement the following in your jurisdiction.

- Remove approximately three (3) parking spaces along the north side of Massachusetts Avenue NW between 6th Street NW and 7th Street/I Street NW.
- Install mandatory lane markings for westbound Massachusetts Avenue for right turn and thru lanes.

Presently, there are no parking meters, nor parking restriction signs along the entire block of Massachusetts Avenue NW between 6th Street and 7th Street/I Street NW. Vehicles have been observed parked in the right most lane on the westbound stop bar and up to two vehicles along the island for the private driveway. The parking forces any vehicles making a westbound right turn from Massachusetts Avenue onto 6th Street to turn right from the center lane, allowing

vehicles a larger turn radius and at higher speeds. This gives less time for pedestrians and vehicles to see each other to avoid conflicts.

In accordance with the DCMR and in support of Washington DC's commitment to the Vision Zero goal, DDOT intends to proceed with parking restrictions along the north side for the entire block, the installation of no parking signs, and mandatory lane movement pavement markings to force right-turning vehicles to turn only from the right-most lane to improve visibility and safety for pedestrians and vehicles.

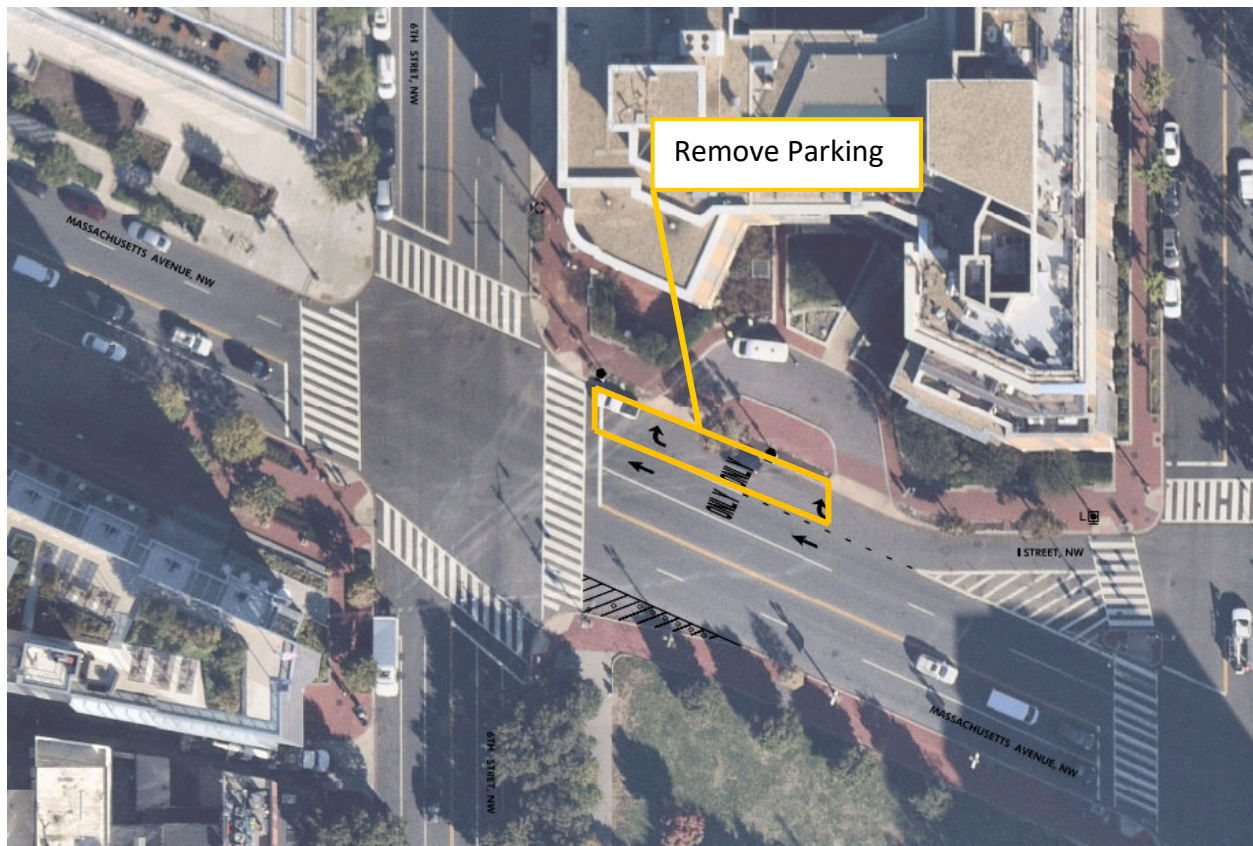


Figure 1 | Proposed Parking Removal and Pavement Marking for Westbound Massachusetts Ave NW

All comments on this subject matter must be filed in writing by Tuesday, September 13, 2022 (thirty business days after the date of this notice), with the District Department of Transportation (DDOT), Transportation Operations Administration at 250 M Street, SE, Washington, D.C. 20003. Comments may also be sent via email to Rahul Jain at rahul.jain@dc.gov.

DDOT will review and evaluate comments and anticipates initiating implementation of the abovementioned modifications starting at the end of the thirty business days, pending weather conditions.
